# **About Scripture**

Still this week, we are looking at Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. It is truly amazing how many important things were discussed in this address that it takes us weeks of sermons to get through it all.

In this section Jesus addresses the unfair treatment experienced resulting from the power imbalance in the state. Officers of Caesar's empire had the authority to inflict corporal punishment, or require citizens to their carry heavy loads. These tactics were often used as a way to embarrass or shame people for their beliefs. Jesus encouraged his followers to turn the other cheek and to go the extra mile, not because he believed that they deserved this abuse, or that we should not stand up to injustice. Quite the opposite, Jesus's suggestion was radical. Rather than fight, and allow Roman officers pleasure from their power, don't let it shame you, offer them more. If you don't let them upset or shame you, their power over you is greatly diminished.

Jesus then takes radical to the next level in suggesting we move beyond eye for an eye retribution. In those days, even tit for tat retribution was a new concept. For time immemorial people had believed they were entitled to unlimited retribution if they were wronged, as we see in the Old Testament with seven-fold vengeance for the death of Cain. But Jesus says, eye for an eye isn't good enough. We need to move beyond retribution and love our enemies. This isn't just a one off thing Jesus says that maybe we can sweep under the rug. It is an over-arching theme of Jesus's ministry. Not that it is an easy task! 2000 years later and knowing how to love our enemies remains one of the biggest challenges of being a follower of Jesus.
