Story Time with Tracie Klaehn and friends

Following Story Time, children and youth will leave for Sunday Morning Activities. Happy Learning!

For babies and toddlers, there is the Family Worship Space at the back of the sanctuary. Each week, there will be an adult present so that the children can play and be cared for while parents worship. Parents are free to come and go from that space, according to the needs of their children.

Scripture - Mark 9: 2 - 9

Where does earth end and heaven begin? When is God's realm already here, and where do we say it hasn't appeared yet? How do we engage the liminal spaces between the human and divine to perceive a new reality that can transform our existing broken one? The transfiguration of Jesus is disorienting to his disciples, and confuses us, as readers, with all its pyrotechnics and voices from above; yet the message is affirming. "This is my Son, the Beloved; listen to him" (Mark 7:9). Haven't we all wanted to hear so clearly who to follow and to trust? It must have been liberating for the first disciples to know that their instincts about leaving their former lives behind and follow this countercultural teacher and healer around the countryside were correct. The hope they had in the love he displayed, the inclusion he taught, and the integrity he embodied was warranted. But what do the disciples do now with this assurance? Try to preserve the moment by building them all a place to live and from which to teach? Tell everyone they know what they saw and heard as confirmation of what they had always felt to be true? The transfiguration answered a big question they had about the identity of Jesus and themselves as his followers. We, like the early disciples, are called not just to teach the ethics of Jesus but to spread hope and a faith that love conquers all.

• Think of a time when you had no adequate words to express the wonder and awe that you were experiencing. It might be a time when you encountered amazing beauty in creation. It might be a time when you were overcome by some aspect of the miracle of human life. It might be a time when you were rendered speechless by your sense of holy presence. What did you experience? What were your feelings? What difference did it make in your life? Sometimes we use an expression like a "mountaintop experience" to identify such a moment. What words would you use to label it on the map of your own life journey?
